

NCWEB is a unique system with lectures on weekends leaving students with five working days to follow their dream. In this neo-age of 100% cut-offs class room crunch, gender discrimination NCWEB is a welcome arrangement and a most satisfactory way to attain a degree from University of Delhi. The Board began functioning in September, 1944 with 3 students. At present, the enrolment is more than 35000. Till 1971, classes for the Undergraduate and Postgraduate courses were held at the Arts Faculty Complex. However, due to the steep increase in number of students, space became a serious problem several Centers had to be opened in various colleges in different parts of Delhi. The Board enables thousands of young women, who cannot join regular college for various reasons to attend classes during Saturdays/Sundays, academic breaks to obtain Undergraduate and Postgraduate Degree from the renowned University of Delhi. However, Non-Collegiate students are not allowed to pursue any other full-time course.

# Capacity Building Workshop to access E-Library Resources

On the occasion of International Women's Day, observed annually on 8th March, the Non-Collegiate Women's Education Board (NCWEB), University of Delhi, in collaboration with the Delhi University Library System (DULS), organized a Capacity Building Workshop to Access E-Library Resources. The successful execution of this workshop reflects the commitment of NCWEB and DULS to inclusive and progressive education. It showcased a model of collaboration that can be emulated by other academic institutions to bridge the digital divide and foster equitable access to educational resources. The event was not only a celebration of women's achievements but also a forward-looking initiative aimed at equipping students with the skills and tools necessary to thrive in a modern, technology-driven academic environment.




